

APMP for PRINCE2® Practitioners

The APMP is an internationally recognised knowledge based qualification (IPMA Level D) that enables you to understand the breadth of skills required to successfully manage a project undertaking.

This blended programme recognises the prior attainment of the PRINCE2® Practitioner qualification and only tests those areas that have not previously been examined. It combines multiple voices, animation and interactive exercises, providing training at a time, pace and location to suit your individual requirements.

Duration

The e-learning will take approximately 12 hours to complete and in addition you can attempt the sample examination questions and undertake private study. We recommend that you set some time aside over a period of four to six weeks to complete the work.

When you've completed the e-learning you will attend a two day workshop with one of our experienced tutors to revise any of the topics you found difficult and gain a refresher of the others. The examination is held on the morning of day two.

Prerequisites

Candidates must already hold the Registered PRINCE2® Practitioner qualification, and would benefit from having around two years relevant practical experience of Project Management.

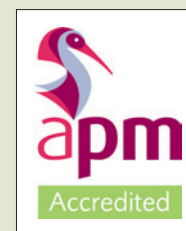
Accreditation
